1.0	<b>Welcome</b>	<b>Action</b>
	<p>Michelle McCallum took the chair in the absence of the Chair and Vice Chair.</p> <p>Michelle opened the meeting and welcomed everyone present.</p> <p>She indicated that the main purposes of the meeting were to find out about the work of Living Streets and to finalise the plans for the Annual Spring Clean on Saturday 24 April. Most of the usual topics would be tabled at the next meeting in May.</p> <p>She introduced Kirstie Henderson from Living Streets Scotland.</p>	
	<p><b>2.0 Presentation by Kirstie Henderson Living Streets Scotland</b></p> <p>Kirstie is an Engaging Communities Officer. She gave a very interesting and informative PowerPoint presentation. She spoke enthusiastically about the work she has been involved in across Scotland. Her work is based on working with communities to help them be as effective as possible in improving their neighbourhoods.</p> <p>Living Streets works with people to create safe, attractive and enjoyable streets, where people want to walk. Kirstie was able to give information about the type of support that could be available to support local projects in the Denny &amp; Dunipace area.</p> <p>Discussion followed her presentation. Roy Bogle (CTRA) spoke about the Dunipace Community Garden and Milton Row Trees Project and possible involvement with Living Streets. He submitted a proposal to Kirstie and a copy to CGI.
